Matthew 24:37-39

Introduction: - Study of a truly grand character

- Study of a truly miraculous event.

- Study of Gen. 6 to Gen. 10.

I. Noah

A. His Character

- 1. He was mentioned as one of the three best men that had ever lived to that time (Ezek. 14:12-20).
- 2. He was God's instrument to save mankind while God executed punishment on a wicked world.
- 3. Faithful among the faithless (<u>Gen. 6:5-8</u>; <u>Gen. 7:1</u>). The character of man had degraded to only a few righteous.
 - 4. He was just and perfect in his generation (Gen. 6:9).
- 5. A preacher of righteousness (2 Pet. 2:5). There was never a more trying task to teach while building an ark over 120 years.
 - B. His ancestors (show overhead based on Gen. 5)
- 1. Enoch Noah's great grandfather. He prophesied concerning the fate of ungodly people (Jude 1:14-15).
 - 2. Methuselah Noah's grandfather.
- a. His name literally means, "He dies, there is a dart." Or, "When he dies, it will come." Methuselah died just prior to the flood.
- b. Adam and Methuselah lived together on the earth for 243 years.
 - 3. Lamech Noah's dad. He lived together with Adam 56 years.
- 4. Noah easily received the historical accounts of Adam via Methuselah and/or Lamech. Noah was born 126 years after Adams death.

II. The Flood - Genesis 7

- A. Amazing story Some doubt this event.
 - 1. Geological proof: Sea shells and fossils found everywhere.
 - 2. Physical proof of the ark itself on Mt. Ararat.
 - 1. Latest satellite picture.
 - 2. Wood found on top of Mt. Ararat.
 - 2. Over 60 "eyewitness" accounts in the last 100 years.
 - 3. Biblical proof in Matt. 24; Luke 17; II Pet. 2; I Pet. 3; Jude 14.
- B. Lessons from the flood.

- 1. Judgment against ungodliness.
- 2. Triumph of right over wrong.
- 3. Foreshadowing of salvation to come and catastrophe.

III. Noah's salvation:

- A. By obedience (Gen. 6:22; Heb. 11:7).
- B. By faith (Heb. 11:7).
- C. By grace (Gen. 6:8).
- D. By water (1 Pet. 3:20-21) and a type of baptism.

IV. Noah's reward.

- A. Blessed of God (Gen. 9:1).
- B. Heir of righteousness (Heb. 11:7).
 - 1. Which came by faith.
 - 2. Heir, not yet possessed.
- C. Not to forget God will never flood the earth again (Gen. 8:21-22).

Conclusion: We can receive God's blessing and become an heir of salvation through water like Noah (1 Pet. 3:20-21).
